What are Pronouns?



Replace Nouns

Instead of saying a name like "Somsak" over and over, we can just say "He".



Short & Sweet

Pronouns make our sentences shorter and help them sound much better!



4 Main Types

Today we will learn about Subject, Object, Possessive, and Reflexive pronouns.

Subject Pronouns

The "Doer"

- ★ Use these when the person is **DOING** the action in a sentence.
- ★ **Words:** I, You, We, They, He, She, It.
- ★ **Example:** "Suda likes to read. **She** reads every day."



Object Pronouns

The "Receiver"

- ★ Use these when the person **RECEIVES** the action.
- ★ **Words:** me, you, us, them, him, her, it.
- ★ **Example:** "The teacher gave the book to me."



Possessive Pronouns

Showing Ownership!

Use these pronouns to show that something belongs to someone.

Words: mine, yours, ours, theirs, his, hers.

Example: "Is this cool yellow backpack yours?"

No, it is **mine**."



Reflexive Pronouns



Doing it yourself!

Use these when the subject and object are the exact same person.

Words: myself, yourself, ourselves, themselves, himself, herself, itself.

Example: "I drew this picture by **myself!**"

Pronoun Review Chart

Subject	Object	Possessive	Reflexive
I	me	mine	myself
You	you	yours	yourself
He	him	his	himself
She	her	hers	herself
We	us	ours	ourselves
They	them	theirs	themselves
